My spiritual journey

Brother Alyas Omeed

My name is Alyas Omeed and I am originally from Afghanistan. I was born to a Muslim family in 1984 in Afghanistan. IN 2008, I moved to Canada as an international student and became a Canadian citizen. I hold two bachelor degrees: Sociology (B.A) Bachelor of Education (B.Ed). In addition, I completed my master degree in Public Policy and Administration (PPA).

My spiritual journey begins when I was told by my family/relatives that Islam is the best religion. As a young child, I believed in their views, and I was never given the choice to question my curiosities, instead, I always was told to pray and follow the Islamic principles. When I was at the age of seven, I lost my eyesight due to a grenade landed in my house in Kabul Afghanistan. This tragedy displayed a huge hopelessness and disappointment to my family without thinking about my potentials in the future. Their focus turned to Islam more than ever before, and following Islam was perceived as a way to restore my eyesight. However, as Islam is empty inside, no prayers have been answered and instead, I encountered more challenges as time went by. With questions/curiosities I had about Islam, it became apparent to me that Islam involves violence, hate and persecution. In addition, I found in Islam the lack of

connection between God and Muslims and I realized that Islam doesn't have a foundation to rely on. As I was growing up, I was coming up with more questions/curiosities such as why Muslims pray in one direction. If God is everywhere and is powerful and can see us, why Muslims then seek God in a one specific direction. My thought was that God is everywhere and can see us wherever we live or whatever direction we pray. However, my family did not like to hear these points from me. Also, I was curious that Muslim women do not possess their basic rights



according to Islamic principles. Although Muslim men are able to do whatever they like to do. Additionally, I did not find a way to establish a relationship with God who I speak with directly in Islam. When I was reading history books, I found that Islam involves violence, hate and persecution.

However, as I lived in Afghanistan and with my family at the time, expressing my views was very difficult and certainly life-threatening for

me. Thus, I needed to stay silent and keep my curiosities to myself. My curiosities have driven me to know Jesus who has been with me through my difficult times and I truly understand he is our heavenly father. I live with him and never feel alone. For the first time, I read the Bible in Braille and really enjoyed it. Over the past many years, I have gone church and made wonderful Christian friends who have helped me to get to know Jesus.

In 2018, I dreamed Jesus and found myself in a position to accept him as my heavenly father. Since I accepted him as my Lord, my life has seen positive changes. For instance, I dreamed him once that I saw two images: One dark without hands and feet. It appeared like a black box. I am told in the dream that this is the God, and I can't establish any relationships because I can't believe in it. In the dream, I come to this conclusion that even if I pray, it is not going to be accepted as it seems like a black box. It can't gain my trust. After 10 seconds, I see an image with smile on his face. I recognized quickly that he is the one that I dreamed and I always dream. I run up to him, and say hello. In the dream, I am trying to talk to him, and I keep saying I miss you, and where have you been. I say I always dream you. I truly see bright eyes, nice nose and a beautiful outfit in him.

He tells me to smile and stay happy. He puts his hand on my right shoulder and tells me that You are not alone. I also remember that he points out to someone on his right hand to help me when I need. He does not walk back, or goes left and right. He flies up and I look up as disappears. When I woke up, I started shaking and prayed up to morning. I want to share my story with people and help anyone to get to know Jesus because he is the solution to all the problems in our lives. He is truly our Lord. You can speak with him directly. It doesn't matter what language we communicate with him. He can see us, he can listen to us and he can take care of us.

My message to all people is if you accept Jesus as your heavenly Father, you develop inner peace in your lives, patience and you love and respect your family more than ever before. Since I became a Christian, I love my wife and children more than ever before. I feel peace inside me and I am a more patient person than my past life.

Over the past 3 months, I have reached out to more than 100 Afghans and Iranians to share the message of our Lord. This includes: Families, couples and individuals. Throughout my interaction with the Persian community here in the city of Barrie and the surrounding cities, I have received positive reactions, which itself has been very encouraging and motivating. Thanks to our amazing lord and his unique joy/love.

In addition, I like to point out the way I reach out to the community and that is to travel at the mutually designated locations and I pay for lunch/dinner or drinks to appreciate their efforts/time to meet with me. Moreover, I had interviews with 2 major Afghans broadcast corporations/televisions based in the UK and U.S. It was a great opportunity for me to share the gospel with the people and invite them to truth.

Ethnic Churches News

Thai Church Pastor Sue & Frank

They resigned the pastoral care at Thai Church and are currently focusing on four groups of new believers located in different places in Ontario. The new ministry includes online bible studies (on Wed/Thu/Sat) and visiting the groups once or twice a month. Three of the groups are farms:

- Ajax Mushroom Farm (4 members)
- Harrison Chicken Farm (4 members). Located in Orangeville. About 40 people attended when invited for a Christmas party last year.
- Leamington Vegetable Farm (4 members). As it is near Windsor, they visit this farm once a month for one night and do fellowship and visit Thai workers for outreach. One of the men was a Buddhist and had bad manners but after believing in Jesus, he was born again.

Please pray for...

1. Their online/offline Bible studies and discipleship trainings
2. The growth of faith in these new believers from the groups, so that it may enable them to share the gospel with their coworkers.
3. The spiritual warfare at Thai church.
4. The Sunday services and the remaining members who attend from distant places
5. The health and anointing of the pastor Sue and Frank, as well as their safe trips for the ministry



Holy Spirit Church Pastor Ihsan Jaro

There has been a spiritual attack in the church since December. Farah is a Northern Iraqi woman who joined the church three years ago. While the pastor was away for two and a half months due to a family visit in 2022, she spread negative rumors about the church and the pastor among church members (there were signs of this before). She approached each family individually and told lies among them, especially the female church members. She has caused division in the church. The pastor has met and talked with her several times, but she condemns him by saying things that are useless and unbiblical. Currently, she does not attend church anymore but meets church members privately.

Please pray for...

1. To embrace Farah's soul with love and for her to repent and turn around
2. The evil spirits that try to divide the church and let them leave in the name of Jesus Christ
3. The Lord can protect Pastor Isan's family and church and give him strength.
4. The church members to have unshakable faith and discernment during hard times and attacks.
5. Arabic-speaking people, so they can come to salvation through this church

Bangladesh Christian Fellowship Brother Mamun Talukder

There are still two semesters left before the Advanced program is finished. Mamun is registered as a Global Gates missionary. He has a mission for evangelism rather than church ministry.

Please pray for...

1. Evangelism: Every weekend, we evangelize near Time Hortons (where Muslims often go, such as those from Bangladesh and India). We are now continuing it with the company of 2 Muslim converts.
2. Banner Ministries: Holding up signs and evangelizing so that more people can come in contact with the gospel. Our goal is to plant 5 house churches over the next 5 years.
3. Mamun's daughter, Naomi, is looking for a job at the hospital as she is about to graduate from her nursing school. She and her son will be baptized this summer. She has many Muslim friends, so she can be a channel of blessing.
4. Pray that salvation will come to Sorav, a friend of her daughter who is studying the Bible together.



Afghanistan/Persian Community Brother Alyas

He received a notice of layoff without good reason last week from the CNIB, where he works. He had to sell a silent machine, but it was difficult because he is blind. The manager was not happy with it, and the pressure on sales was severe.

Currently, he receives \$2,000 every month from ODSP, but it is still a big burden to support a family of two children and pay rent. He has an option to sue the company, but he also has to pay the lawyer's fee in advance.

He wants to forgive them rather than solving problems in the court.

Please pray for...

1. The Lord to guide him to the best solution and lead him to a new job pleasing to His good will.
2. His health—for the relief of sick symptoms such as dizziness

Thai Church Sister Palmy

Since Pastor Frank and Sue left, the church has no leader and 3-4 families are gathering for Sunday service.

Sister Palmy, who had been attending Thai Church since 2009, also left the church last week to help Sue and Frank with their ministry. A family member who was part of Thai church in its early days has retired from business and joined the church again. They are visiting members who left the church due to conflicts and misunderstandings during pandemic, encouraging them to come back to the church.

2. The remaining members to stay firmly in faith and strive for evangelism
3. A new leader to pastor them.

A Ministry for the Newcomers in North York (Steven Xu)

Description of the ESL Ministry at A Quiet Place

This is a joint venture between A Quiet Place and Mission Toronto-Citywide Mosaic Fellowship.

The goal is to evangelize the newcomers through ESL programs and equip the new believers to follow Jesus faithfully in North York through ESL bible studies. By doing so, A Quiet Place is dedicated to helping the newcomers transition to Canadian society culturally, linguistically, eventually to God's Kingdom spiritually.

The Inspiration from the Scripture Verses

This ministry idea came from a passage in Mark 6:30-44. In this passage, the disciples presumably were busy with ministry so that they could not have time to eat. However, after they decided to be QUIET in front of Jesus, people recognized them and followed them, eventually being led to Jesus who in turn taught them "a lot of things". As a result, they experienced Jesus's feeding. The possible interpretation is that they were fed spiritually and physically. This is what A Quiet Place is inspired to do. We are trying to QUIET in front of Jesus by trusting Him and worshipping Him; and we are answering the call from our Lord Jesus to minister to those who are brought to us by God. Our hope is that we can lead people to God's Kingdom through the service we are called to do.

Ministry Built from Historical and Cultural Experiences at Downtown Toronto

I started getting involved into this ministry in 2013 at Toronto Chinese Baptist Church (TCBC). Ever since then, I have been working with ministers from different countries such as Singapore, Canada, America, China in order to reach out to the migrant workers, refugees, international students and new immigrants in the Greater Toronto Area. I was mentored by a missionary, Dr. Toh, from Singapore to pioneer the ministry at a location, donated by a Taiwanese Pastor, near University of Toronto (St. George Campus). Therefore, it has been a very multicultural ministry experience for me. Eventually, I became a certificated ESL teacher and ministry leader from being an ESL student.

God Provided Us a Place for Worship and Fellowship in North York

In 2020 when the COVID broke out in the city, we stopped meeting in person and went on to meet for ESL lessons and Bible Studies online. In 2021, I was terminated with Christ the King which had sponsored me in this ministry for years. Under God's guidance, I went on to join in Rev. Lordwin's ministry. A few months later, God miraculously provided us a place in a private college (Ace Acumen Academy, 1470 Don Mills Road, North York) to meet for worship and

fellowship for free of charge. We ended up having a few classrooms available for us.

Encountering a Missiary Couple at Adam House in North York

As I was praying about how to continue the ministry I had been passionate about, Rev. Lordwin encouraged me to start ESL ministry in person at A Quiet Place again. At the same time, he also introduced a missionary couple who just returned from central Asia to me and we surprisingly found out that we would share the same vision of ministering the internationals through ESL programs. So far, we have both been involved in the ministry (ESL Bible Studies) which made me believe that we could work together to run ESL classes at Ace Acumen Academy in order to reach out to the newcomers in the North York Region.

Resuming the ESL Ministry

Since May 2023, we have been running ESL classes for the beginners and intermediate; and we have students from Iran, Mongolia and China. As for now, we are taking a break from the ESL class as our students are travelling back to their homes while keeping the worship and ESL bible studies on Sundays. We are planning to continue the ESL classes starting from September 2023.

We ask you to pray for A QUIET PLACE to help newcomers through ESL ministry.

2023 M.O.S.A.I.C. Cultural Festival

The assembly of Christians and a few non-Christians at the 2023 Mosaic Cultural Festival from different ethnicities was a testament to openness to others and a paragon of Psalm 133. Many celebrated cheerfully and participated with other ethnic groups by applause and ovation.

One of the best highlights of the gathering was the “Gospel”, a dance drama with background music performed by the Musical Branches Ministry, as it attracted the most attention from the crowd - several people from the audience grabbed their cameras to shoot a video of the performance. The dancers conveyed the stories from Genesis to the Gospels as they depicted the fall of humanity and how Jesus came to earth to die and was resurrected from the dead to join God. The progression from elation as God created the universe to the fall of humanity was expressed by an upbeat tune to sombre and eerie music. The dancers moved gracefully along with the transitioning piece, and the play ended when Jesus was resurrected from the dead to embrace his heavenly Father with a joyful tune from the backdrop and acclamation from the crowd.

While some performances, like the dance drama, need no words to express the meaning, certain singing stages were left wanting. Each ethnic church group came to the stage to sing praise songs in their native vernacular. The crowd could have empathized with the group if there had been a subtitle to describe each verse in the music, but there was no description except for maybe one or two groups.

Overall, the assembly was inspiring as people from various Christian ethnic groups performed, and some non-Christians attended. The event took place post-pandemic for the first time, after several years of grievous lockdown, and the expression of cultural diversity expressed

in Christian songs and other performances was incredible. The facilitators deserve resounding applause as the prodigious event unwaveringly embraced ethnic diversity, and the staff members who served quietly from behind the scenes merit thorough recognition for their dedication.



The international Students Ministry in Centennial College

Centennial College is one of Canada's most culturally diverse post-secondary institutions.

More than 50% of the students at Centennial College are international students. In 2023, Centennial has hosted over 16,000 international students from 142 countries (<https://www.centennialcollege.ca/admissions/why-choose-centennial/reasons-to-choose-centennial>). For many of these students, it is their first time away from their home country and their first time away from family. Many of these international students come from a very community oriented culture and when they arrive to study in Canada, they experience isolation, loneliness and worries, as they navigate school, economic and financial demands and the customs and culture of Canada. We want to build relationships among this community and to make Jesus known as we meet physical, emotional and spiritual needs.

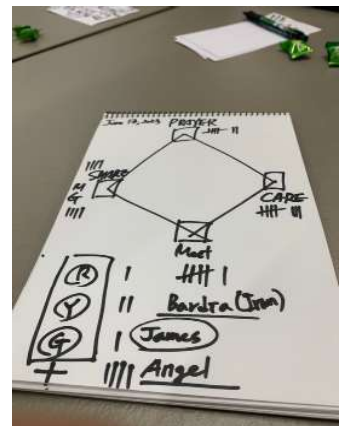
In April, 2023, we began visiting Centennial College, Progress Road campus, the largest campus in Centennial College, for evangelism training and outreach to international students. Our team began with three members and has since grown to about eight. We meet Tuesday afternoons for a time of encouragement and training, followed by outreach and care to students. Our goal

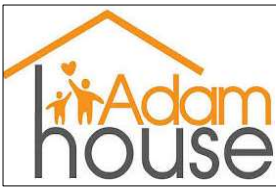
is to share Christ with students and to help students on campus connect together to discover more about Jesus. At the end of May 2023, we were able to get the required number of student signatures to apply to start a student club on campus, called 12 Stones Club. By God's grace, we were able to connect with two committed Christian international students who would be the president and vice-president of our club.

We will be holding weekly meetings for students, to provide community support and care for one another, whatever stage they are on in their spiritual journey. As we meet for fellowship, discussions and prayer, we hope that each student will be drawn closer to Christ, to know His salvation and transforming power that comes from a life committed to following Him. Using the Discovery Bible Study method, we will be doing evangelism and discipleship training.

Please pray for the Holy Spirit's leading for our team as we reach out and care for those students God is preparing for us. Pray that the 12 Stones

Club can be a place of support and community for students who come and that these students will know the salvation through Jesus and the transforming power that comes from knowing and following Him.





Adam House North News

As if to celebrate the arrival of spring 2023, more good news has been received at Adam House during the 3 months of April, May and June. In April, Adam House Hanson, a new Transitional Home for refugees, was opened, and Brother A's family from Mexico and Brothers R and F from Congo became the first families of Hanson House. In addition, Bonnie, who came as the new spiritual coordinator of Hanson House, joined the group, and the first Bible study at Hanson House began. With the support of Mil Al Church all residents staying at Adam House North, Booth and Hanson watched on a musical performing at Church on the Queensway in celebration of Easter. I was also impressed by the musical of Passion Play. In the evening after the musical, we had dinner together prepared by Ayzi, a member of the Adam House staff, and had Holy Communion while meditating on Jesus, who died for us and rose again.

In mid-April, Brother B and his family from Peru came to AH North and we celebrated the first birthday of Brother A's second child from Mexico, with a birthday party at Hanson House with plenty of Mexican food.

In May, a new sister S from Malawi was admitted to stay in AH North, and there was a farewell party for Ayzi, a staff member who was in charge of the settlement of refugees at Adam House. In addition, the hearing interview, which is important for the refugee claim process of sister P from Malawi, was conducted well by the grace of God. At the end of May, we all participated in the 2023 Mosaic Cultural Festival at 105 Gibson Centre hosted by CMCA, where we shared performances and food from each country. In particular, the Malawian brothers and sisters at Adam House prepared a special performance and sang in their language.

In June, Brother B from Ethiopia moved into AH North, and Sister E from Iran moved out to a new home. In celebration of World Refugee Day, we participated in the People Church's 5K Walk Run and Roll for Refugee and met with communities and refugees. World Refugee Sunday was held to

celebrate the renovation and reopening of Adam House Gladstone, which used to be the main office and shelter of Adam House. It was a time for refugees and local churches to celebrate and rejoice together for the first time in a long period of renovation. A few months ago, I heard that Brother E, an Iranian who had entered Adam House North, has been granted refugee status. Hallelujah! It was a time to witness and celebrate how God watched over the lives of each refugee and guided them in the best way. We prayed together for the future invitation of his family in Iran and for Mr. E's stronger faith.

Canada Mosaic Christian Alliance (CMCA) is a mission organization in Toronto, Canada.

We desire to make the Kingdom Multiplication Movement by making disciples of all nations in a holistic way to, from, and beyond diaspora. We are willing to put in practice the vision and strategy of reverse missions through diaspora in order to accomplish the remaining task of world evangelization. We are focused on the ethnic church planting multiplication movement among the unreached people groups in North America. Please pray that:

Training 2, and 4 Days Training of Kingdom Multiplication Movement) can be well developed so that 1.5 and second generation of Korean diaspora can be added to the Mosaic missions as volunteers. Lead us to connect with the people of peace that God has prepared for each people without a church.

3. To educate and train ethnic church leaders in partnership with Gateway Seminary & Harvest Connection at the Advance Program of Gateway Seminary, providing the five ethnic interns for missions and pastoral ministry, three Bengali brothers Mamun, Philip, Chinmoy, Persian sister N and Persian brother John, with the necessary strength, wisdom and finances in completing the 2-year program; Lead each of them to start their own ministry as intern pastors and missionaries; Canada Mosaic College can be built for the multi-ethnic Mosaic ministries in Toronto in the future. Please lead many pastors and believers of local churches to participate in the newly launched Mosaic Urban Missionaries & Local missional Leaders Training Diploma course(2 year, 8 subjects, 24 credits) in September in partnership with Tyndale Intercultural Ministries Centre.

4. Ethnic churches in CMCA can have the vision of Kingdom multiplication movement to plant their ethnic churches in every city; these churches include the Vietnamese church(Tim), Thai church (Frank & Sue), Burmese church(Solomon), Arabic Holy Spirit church(Ihsan), Nepalese church (Peter), Hope Nepalese Church(Anmol),

Congolese church(Emmanuel), Bengali church(Mamun, Philip, Chinmoy), Pakistani/Indian Leaf church (Robin), Parss church (Vahid), Zimbabwean church(Stephen), Indian church(Sam John), Eritrean church (Mnnassie), Ethiopian church(Mebrahtu), Arabic Bible Church(Richard), Living Word Church(Henock), The King's Church (Spanish, Mauricio), Arise Church (Filipino, Charisma), Brampton Life Church (Arab, Lee Hong-Jong), Albanian Church(Endrit); May Zimbabwean pastor Stephen make a full recovery from stroke, and help us find supporting churches for Eritrean Church, Ethiopian Churches(Mebarhtu), Parss Church(Bahid) that are seeking for a place to gather.
